"MAID OF LINCOLN" (S.S.)

FINDING of a Court of Inquiry held at Fremantle, W.A.,
into the loss of the S.S. "MAID OF LINCOLN," of
Adelaide, S.A., Official No. 89,419, tonnage 32,
on the 9th April 1891.

We find that the British screw steamer "Maid of
Lincoln" was stranded on a reef off the mouth of the
Hill River while on her voyage from Dongalla to
Fremantle, and has since become a total wreck through
your carelessness of navigation.

We, therefore, under the powers granted unto us
under the Local Ordinance, 28 Vic. No. 2 and 51 Vic.
No. 6, suspend your local certificate of competency
No. 141 as master mariner for a term of (6) six calendar
months from this date.
