ELING.

A village and extensive parish in the New Forest division of the county, near the head of the Southampton water, on the western side, one mile south from Totton station on the Southampton and Dorchester section of the London and South Western railway, 5 miles west from Southampton, 6½ south from Romsey and 86 from London, in the hundred of Redbridge, New Forest union, Lyndhurst district of the Lymington & New Forest petty sessional division, Southampton county court district, rural deanery of Lyndhurst and archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester. There are timber wharves, breweries, creosote, pitch, naphtha and chemical works and other business warehouses. There were five ecclesiastical parishes formed out of Eling, viz. : Eling, North Eling (also called Copythorne), Netley Marsh, Marchwood and Colbury. These were constituted separate civil parishes by an order of County Council, September, 1893, and confirmed July, 1894. Eling parish contains the villages of Eling, Rumbridge Street and Totton; details of latter villages are given under the separate heading (see Totton). The parish church (St. Mary) is one of the oldest and most beautiful in the neighbourhood of Southampton, it is situated upon a spur of Eling hill and overlooking Southampton water. Traces of its Saxon construction are seen in the arches of the north and south aisles, in the north windows of the sanctuary and the outer but-

tresses of the north wall: in 1865 the chancel, south aisle and greater portion of the nave were rebuilt in the Early English style, and since 1870 the interior has been thoroughly restored and reseated at a cost of £500: the reredos, of Caen stone, the gift of the late Miss Sturgess Bourne, includes a representation of the Nativity, and there are several stained glass windows and an ancient painting of the Last Supper, formerly the altar piece: in the tower is a set of six bells with quaint inscriptions. A lych gate, designed by Percy Stone F.S.A. was erected in 1901 as a memorial of the coronation of the late King Edward VII. The church affords 600 sittings. The registers date back to 1537 and contain among other things a record of a marriage performed by Richard Cromwell. The living is a vicarage, attached before the dissolution of the monasteries to Mottisfont, with Totton annexed, net yearly value £800, including 200 acres of glebe with residence, in the gift of J. E. Ward esq. and held since 1897 by the Rev. Thomas Thistle M.A. of Corpus Christi college, Oxford, late master of Hereford school. A fair is held here on July 5th. The Downes, the property of Peter Leckie esq. and the residence of Louis Dwarries-Gibbs esq. stands in grounds of 140 acres. Mrs. Vaudrey-Barker-Mill of Langley manor, Vere H. Birch-Reynardson esq. & Capt. A. P. Beaumont J.P. are the chief landowners. The area is 2,124 acres of land, 10 of water, 77 of tidal water and 302 of foreshore, and the rest woodland, arable and pasture. The population in 1901

COLBURY, formerly a tithing and ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1872 from the civil parish of Eling, now constituted a separate civil parish under Section 57 of the "Local Government Act, 1888" (51 & 52 Vict. c. 41), by order of County Council, confirmed July, 1894, 1 mile from Lyndhurst Road railway station on the London and South Western railway, 1½ miles west from Eling and 6 west from Southampton, in the New Forest division of the county, Redbridge hundred, New Forest union, Southampton County Court district, petty sessional division of Lyndhurst, rural deanery of Lyndhurst and archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester; the parish comprises the villages of Colbury and Longdown. Christ Church, erected 1870, at the cost of the late Frederick Ibbotson esq. is a building of flint and stone, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave, north porch and a turret with small spire containing one bell; there are 200 sittings. The register dates from the year 1872. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value, £200 with residence, in the gift of Mrs. Vaudrey-Barker-Mill, daughter of the founder, and held since 1901 by the Rev. Charles Maturin B.A. of Pembroke College, Cambridge, who is also chaplain to the New Forest union. The vicarage house is pleasantly seated close to the church. There is a Wesleyan chapel at Longdown. The New Forest Union house is in this parish. Langley manor is the property and residence of Mrs Vaudrey-Barker-Mill, who is lady of the manor and principal landowner: the mansion situated on an eminence, is of red brick in the style of the 15th century, and affords extensive and picturesque views of the New Forest, Southampton Water and the Isle of Wight. The soil is strong clay; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are oats,

barley, with some land in pasture. The area is 5,468 acres of land and 4 of water; rateable value, £7,816; the population in 1901 was 998, including 8 officers and 74 inmates of the New Forest workhouse. At Hounslow is a small iron mission church, where services are held at 6.30 p.m. from October to June.

HOUND and NETLEY ABBEY.

Hound is a village and parish on the banks of Southampton Water, with a station called "Netley" on the London and South Western railway, equidistant from the villages of Hound and Netley Abbey, and is $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles south-east-by-east from Southampton, in the Southern division of the county. hundred of Mansbridge, South Stoneham union, petty sessional division and county court district of Southampton, rural deanery of Southampton and archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester. The old church of St. Mary at Hound is a building of stone, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave, south porch and a tower containing 3 bells. The new church of St. Edward the Confessor, Netley Abbey, erected in 1885-6 at a cost of £7,060 and consecrated by the Bishop of Winchester Oct. 13th, 1886, and now the parish church, is an edifice of stone, consisting of a nave 25 feet wide by 70 feet long, chancel about 30 feet long, separated from the nave by an alabaster screen, transepts, or short aisles, each with a bay of two arches on either side of the nave, and south transept opening into the tower, which stands at the south of the chancel: on the north sides are the vestries, with organ chambers over, and at the west end is the baptistery and porch, opening into the church by an arcade: the chancel roof is divided into four bays by principals, and is boarded and panelled throughout: the panels of this roof are painted; the eastern bay has a blue ground, with gilt leaden stars arranged upon it; the rest of the panels have a white ground, upon which are painted various devices enclosed in a pattern of bold foliation in green and gold; the ribs are vermilion and the bosses gilt: the centre devices are the monograms of the Saviour, of St. Edward the Confessor, and of others of the Saints, with a figure of the patron Saint giving his ring to the poor man who solicited alms of him, in the legends of the Saints, and a further illustration of the Saint in his favourite pastime of hunting: the style adopted in the design of this church is that of the 14th century, but the treatment of the building is both original and modern throughout: the tower is of three stages, with

battlements, and contains 8 bells from the foundry of Messrs. Warner & Co.: the tenor bell records that these bells were given by Col. Crichton, and below the inscription run these words—

On earth bells do ring,
In heaven the angels sing
Alleluia.

A stained glass memorial was erected in the east end window of the church under the will of the late Miss Rashleigh; the window represents the Ascension and has at the base the inscription "To the Glory of God in memory of Laura Arundell and Lydia Jane Cumming Rashleigh." There are sittings for about 500 persons. The register dates from the year 1792. The living is a discharged vicarage, net yearly value £200, including 18 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of Winchester College, and held since 1892 by the Rev. William Alfred Cramer Chevalier, Assoc. of King's College, London. The Abbey of SS. Mary and Edward was founded by Henry III. in 1237, and colonized by the Cistercians of Beaulieu; the church, when perfect, consisted of presbytery of four bays, transepts with eastern chapels, two in each, nave of eight bays and a central tower, and measured internally was about 215 feet long by 58 feet wide across nave and aisles, with a transept 120 feet in length; the ruins are still extensive, and include the whole of the church except the north arm of the transept, and on the east side of the cloister-garth, 115 feet square, the sacristy, the chapter house, 33 by 35 feet, the common house, about 70 by 25 feet, and originally vaulted in two alleys, and adjoining it on the south the kitchen, 50 feet by 18 feet 6 inches, with a fine hooded fire-place of Early English date; on the south side is the Early English door of the refectory, with remains of the lavatory, and on the west side the porter's lodge: at the Dissolution there were 12 monks and revenues estimated at £100. The Royal Victoria Hospital, a noble and very extensive building, was erected in 1855-63, at a cost of over £400,000, for the reception of invalided soldiers; the foundation stone was laid by Queen Victoria in May, 1856, and the

hospital was opened in March, 1863. The hospital is under the control of the principal medical officer, and is available for 1,400 patients; the mess room, reading and ante rooms and the quarters of the medical staff officers form a separate block close to the hospital, and there is another block, opened in March, 1870, for the treatment of soldiers suffering from insanity. There is an attached cemetery of about 17 acres. The recreation ground was presented in 1900 by Tankerville Chamberlayne esq. in commemoration of the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Victoria. Tankerville Chamberlayne esq. B.A. of Cranbury Park, Winchester, is lord of the manor and chief landowner. The soil is sandy; subsoil, gravel. The chief crops are wheat, oats, barley & pasture. The area is 2,744 acres of land, 6 of water and 540 of tidal water and 222 foreshore; rateable value, March, 1911, Hound £18,105. Population in 1901 was 4,548, including 2,267 in the Royal Victoria Hospital and adjoining buildings.

Netley and Hound are tithings in the parish of Hound. There is a Congregational Chapel at Netley, erected in 1901, with 200 sittings.

HYTHE.

A small town on the western side of South-
 ampton Water, 2 miles from Southampton by
 steam ferry and 11 by land, 6 from Totton
 railway station, 7 from Redbridge station,
 both on the London and South Western
 railway, and 91 from London. It is an
 ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1841 from
 the civil parish of Fawley, in the New Forest
 division of the county, Dibden liberty, New
 Forest union, Southampton county court
 district, Lymington petty sessional division,
 rural deanery of Southampton, and arch-
 deaconry and diocese of Winchester. Here is
 a neat iron pier, 2,100 feet long and 4 feet
 above high water mark, constructed in 1879,
 and steamboats ply to and fro nearly every
 hour. The village is supplied with water
 by the Southampton Water Company. Here
 is a police station, where petty sessions
 are held the last Thursday in the month
 (Christopher H. H. Candy, clerk, 40 and
 41 High street, Southampton). The church,
 dedicated to St. John, erected in 1874, at a
 cost of £4,500 and bearing the date of register
 1823, is a neat edifice built of red brick, with
 Bath stone dressings, in the Early English
 style, consisting of chancel, nave of four bays,
 north aisle, west porch and a bell-cot at the
 east end; the organ was presented in 1897
 by the late J. B. Fleuret esq.: the church
 will seat about 500 persons. The living is a
 vicarage, net yearly value £200, in the gift
 of the rector of Fawley, and held since 1912
 by the Rev. Francis Edward Yarborough
 Hooke M.A. of Keble College, Oxford. Here
 is a Congregational chapel, seating 160, and
 a parish room capable of seating 200 persons.
 The Hythe Yacht Club was established in
 January 1894: the club house, at the end of
 the pier, is admirably placed for observing

the races, and was extensively altered and
 enlarged at the close of 1894. Races are
 held periodically during the summer months:
 the club burgee is blue, with a red saltire:
 there are now 120 members, and the total
 tonnage of yachts is about 1,500 tons. The
 Oddfellows' Hall, which stands in the centre
 of the village, was built in 1884, at a cost of
 £650, and will seat 350 persons. Andrew
 Cecil Drummond esq. D.L., J.P. of Cadland
 House, Fawley, is lord of the manor and
 chief landowner. The soil is light sand;
 subsoil, gravel. The chief crops are wheat,
 barley and oats, also much pasturage. The
 area is 600 acres; rateable value, inclusive
 of Fawley, £9,975. Population in 1901 was
 761.

LANGDOWN is a hamlet 1 mile south-west,
 in Dibden parish.

ITCHEN

(ST. MARY EXTRA, PEARTREE GREEN, SHOLING, WESTON, NEWTOWN &
 WOOLSTON are now united & called the parish of ITCHEN)

A civil parish formed by Local Government Board Order No. 44,465, dated February 11th, 1903, and governed by the Itchen Urban District Council of 15 members, formed by Local Government Board Order No. 37,124, dated April 1st, 1898, and re-formed March, 1903, and includes the former civil parish of Sholing and St. Mary Extra and the ecclesiastical parishes of Weston and Woolston, Sholing, Weston and Newtown

and Woolston will be found under separate headings. It extends from Bitterne to Netley on the eastern bank of the river Itchen, in the Southern division of the county, parliamentary borough of Southampton, hundred of Mainsbridge, Southampton petty sessional division and county court district, union of South Stoneham, Southampton rural deanery and in the archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester. St. Mary Extra is an ecclesiastical parish on the eastern bank of the river Itchen, facing the town of Southampton, with which it is connected by means of a floating bridge, which crosses the river every seven minutes, and near to Woolston station on the Southampton and Netley section of the London and South Western railway. The parish is called St. Mary Extra from its having been at one time a chapelry to the parish of St. Mary in Southampton town; it extends from Bitterne to Netley, and contains many handsome residences, mostly occupied by the traders of Southampton: the tithings of Woolston and Weston (given under separate headings) and the villages of Itchen, Peartree Green, Weston Common and Newtown are all within the ecclesiastical parish, which is supplied by the South Hants Water Company with excellent water, derived from the chalk hills 3 miles beyond Romsey. The church, known as Jesus chapel and situated on Peartree Green, formerly a small edifice of stone in the Gothic style, was erected 1620 and enlarged 1822. It consists of nave of 3 bays, north aisle, organ chamber and south transept: the north aisle was added in 1846, the organ chamber in 1866 and the chancel was erected in 1883 at a cost of £2,050: there are 600 sittings: date of register, 1671. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £170, including glebe (£40), with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Winchester, and held since 1860 by the Rev. Thomas Lewis Owen Davies M.A. of Exeter College, Oxford, and surrogate, who resides at Peartree vicarage, Vicarage road, Woolston. Here is also a Masonic hall, in Manor road, which is used for meetings of the Freemasons and also for entertainments, public meetings &c. There is a Congregational church on Pear Tree Green, built in 1841 and seating 350, also a Church Mission Hall near Itchen Ferry. There is a cemetery (opened in 1879), which cost about £1,200, and is 10 acres in extent, situated on Weston common, for this parish, exclusive of Sholing and Weston: there is one mortuary chapel. The Ecclesiastical Commissioners are lords of the manor and chief landowners. The soil is mixed; sub-soil, gravel and clay. The chief crops are

wheat, oats and barley. The area of Itchen civil parish is 2,078 acres of land, 305 of tidal water and 336 of foreshore. Population in 1911 was 19,487. Rateable value, March 1912, £65,239.

SHOLING OR SCHOLING

A village and ecclesiastical district, formed in 1867 from the parishes of Hound and St. Mary Extra, and now, for the most part, in the civil parish of Itchen, $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from Southampton, $1\frac{1}{2}$ from Itchen floating bridge, having a station on the Southampton, Netley and Portsmouth railway. It is situated on the river Itchen, in the southern division of the county, Southampton county court district and petty sessional division, union of South Stoneham and Southampton rural deanery and Winchester archdeaconry and diocese, and mostly within the Itchen Urban District. Villas have been erected and roads laid out, making the district a pleasant spot for private residences of the Southampton tradesmen and others. The church (St. Mary) is a neat stone edifice in the Early English style, costing £2,000, having an apsidal chancel, nave, north transept, south porch, small spire and one bell: the register dates from the year 1866: there are 321 sittings. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £280, including $1\frac{3}{4}$ acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Winchester, and held since 1866 by the Rev. Francis Davidson. Tankerville Chamberlayne esq. B.A. of Cranbury Park, Winchester, is lord of the manor and chief landowner. The soil is sandy; subsoil, gravel. The chief crops are wheat, oats and barley; strawberries also are grown in considerable quantities. The area is 596 acres of land and 2 of water. The population in 1901 was 5,934 in the ecclesiastical parish.

The National School, erected by J. H. Forbes esq. in North East road, is now used principally as a mission room

The Council School (opposite the church), built in 1871, was in 1883 transferred to the St. Mary Extra School Board, enlarged in 1887, & is now managed by the Education Committee of the County Council & used for girls & infants; average attendance, 243 girls & 295 infants; Mrs. L. K. Kellaway, girls' mistress; Mrs. A. H. Hunt, infants' mistress

The Council School, built in 1886 by the Hound School Board & enlarged in 1893 & 1906 at a total cost of about £3,300, is used for boys only; average attendance, 341; John Horace Wood, master

A new infants' school, to accommodate 420 children, has been built next the boys' school, & the infants have been transferred to this building

There is a Primitive Methodist chapel, built 1855, enlarged 1862; also a Baptist chapel & school rooms built of red brick in 1887; the Plymouth Brethren & United Methodists have also chapels here. Salvation Army have barracks here

Netley and Woolston, and extends to Southampton Water, about 2½ miles south-east from Southampton, and 1 south from Woolston station on the Southampton and Netley branch of the London and South Western railway, in the southern division of the county, hundred of Mansbridge, Southampton petty sessional division and county court district, union of South Stoneham, rural deanery of Southampton and archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester. The church (Holy Trinity) is a building of stone in the Decorated style, having a chancel, nave of four bays, north aisle, porch and a tower with spire, containing 3 bells: it was erected at the sole cost of the late Rev. William Preston Hulton M.A. (d. 1870) at a cost of about £5,000 and contains 250 sittings: the register dates from 1866. The living is a vicarage, with house, net yearly value £130, in the gift of the Bishop of Winchester, and held since 1879 by the Rev. George William Walter Minns LL.B., F.S.A. of St. Catherine's College, Cambridge, who resides at The Cliff. Two ornamental arches span the road here, and at Mayfield is an obelisk in honour of the Rt. Hon.

Charles James Fox M.P. who died 13 Sept. 1806, erected by William Chamberlayne esq. who was M.P. for Southampton 1812-1826. On the shore is a curious and ancient seaweed hut, used by the fishermen. Weston Grove is the residence of Alexander Macdonald esq. Tankerville Chamberlayne esq. B.A. of Cranbury Park, Winchester, is lord of the manor and principal landowner. The soil is sandy; subsoil, gravel. The chief crops are wheat, oats, barley and pasture. The area is 500 acres. The population in 1901 was 359.

MARCHWOOD.

An ecclesiastical district and tithing formed from the civil parish of Eling in 1843, constituted a civil parish under section 57 of the Local Government Act, 1888 (51 and 52 Vict. c. 41), by order of the County Council, confirmed 16th July, 1894. It is situated on the west bank of Southampton Water, 2½ miles south-east from Eling, 7½ miles from Southampton and 3 south-east from Totton railway station on the London & South Western railway, in the New Forest division of the county, Redbridge hundred, petty sessional division of Lymington, New Forest union, Southampton county court district, rural deanery of Lyndhurst and arch-deaconry and diocese of Winchester. The scenery around is most picturesque. Here are some extensive Government powder magazines (Royal Naval Ordnance depôt); 1 inspector and 2 sergeants and 20 constables of the Metropolitan police. A ferry boat runs from this place to Millbrook.

The church, dedicated to St. John, is built of white brick and stone, in the Early English style, having a nave, chancel, aisles, transepts, tower and spire, with clock and one bell: it has several stained windows, one

being a memorial window presented by Major William Sawyer, in memory of his child: the church was renovated in 1895, at a cost of £820, and affords 400 sittings. The register dates from the year 1845. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £180 including 18 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Winchester, and held since 1911 by the Rev. William Rooke M.A. of Trinity College, Dublin. Here is a Congregational chapel with 100 sittings. Marchwood Park is the property and residence of Mrs. Ross Porter: the mansion stands in 187 acres of grounds containing some splendid cedar trees. Byams, the seat of Major Henry J. G. Lloyd, was rebuilt in 1878; the old house was in possession of the family for over a century. The principal landowners are Mrs. Vaudrey-Barker-Mill, of Langley Manor, who is also lady of the Manor, Mrs. Porter, of Marchwood Park, and Major Henry J. G. Lloyd, of Byams. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats. The area is 1,595 acres of land, 4 of water, 104 of tidal water and 181 of foreshore. Population (1901), 611. Rateable value, £3,038.

MILLBROOK.

See also SOUTHAMPTON & REDBRIDGE.

A scattered village at the head of Southampton Water, and on the road from Southampton to Romsey, with a station on the Southampton and Dorchester branch of the London and South Western railway, and is 2 miles west-north-west from Southampton; it is included in the Parliamentary Borough of Southampton under the "Redistribution of Seats Act, 1885" (48 & 49 Vict. c. 23), and is in Mansbridge hundred, South Stoneham union, Southampton petty sessional division and county court district, and in the rural deanery of Southampton and archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester. Under the provisions of the "Southampton Borough Extension Act," which came into force Nov. 9th 1895, a part of the old civil parish of Millbrook, including Freemantle, was added to Southampton municipal borough, the remainder being amalgamated with Shirley for civil purposes. There are two churches. The parish church (dedicated to the Holy Trinity) was erected during the period 1873-80 at a cost of £14,000, in the place of St. Nicholas, bearing date of register 1633: the building is handsome, in the Early English style, from the designs of Mr. Woodyer, architect, and consists of nave, chancel, aisles, tower of Swanage stone with spire 150 feet high and containing 4 bells, 3 of which were hung as part of the Millbrook Jubilee Memorial: the east window is stained and there is a series of windows on the north side, given by the late Mrs. E. Best, of Millbrook, besides others: the seats, numbering 700, are all free. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £295, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Winchester, and held since 1907 by the Rev. George Goodenough Elton M.A. of Oriel College, Oxford, who resides at the Rectory, Millbrook road, Southampton. The old (St. Nicholas) church is a plain structure, consisting of chancel and nave (erected in 1829) and an ancient embattled tower containing one bell; it has latterly been used as a mortuary chapel, but is now being thoroughly restored and will have sittings for about 500 persons. There is a Wesleyan Methodist church at Wimpson. The charities, left by the Rev. William Harvest B.A. Mrs. S. Pollen, Mrs.

The South Hants Water Works Co. was established in 1876 under an Act 39 and 40 Vict. for the purpose of supplying the town of Romsey, the surrounding districts and the populous suburbs of Southampton; the water is drawn from two wells sunk in the chalk in the parish of Timsbury. Mrs. Vaudrey-Barker-Mill, of Langley manor, Colbury, is lady of the manor and principal landowner. A court leet is held twice a year at the Ship Hotel, Redbridge. The soil is good loam; subsoil clay. NETLEY MARSH.

(With WOODLANDS and LITTLE TESTWOOD.)

A tithing and ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1855 from the civil parish of Eling, constituted a civil parish under sec. 57 of the "Local Government Act, 1888" (51 and 52 Vict. c. 41), by order of the County Council, confirmed 16th July, 1894; it is on the road from Southampton and Romsey to Ringwood, and is 2 miles west from Totton station on the London and South Western railway, 2 west from Eling and 7 west from Southampton, in the New Forest division of the county, Redbridge hundred, petty sessional division of Lymington (Lyndhurst subdivision), New Forest union, Southampton county court district and rural deanery of Lyndhurst, archdeaconry and diocese of Winchester. The parish comprises Netley, Woodlands and Little Testwood. Tatchbury Manor and Tatchbury Mount, Loperwood, Hill Street, Calmore, part of Bartley and Ower are also in this parish. The church, dedicated to St. Matthew, and bearing date of register 1855, is a small edifice of stone, in the Early English style, having a nave, chancel, aisles, south porch, bell turret

and one bell, and contains 320 sittings. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £185, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Eling and held since 1896 by the Rev. Thomas Henry Royal Oakes B.D. (U.S.A.). Here is a Congregational chapel, built in 1901, seating 100. There is a mission church at Calmore and a Brethren's meeting room at Woodlands. Calmore is a village in this parish. Tatchbury Manor is the residence and property of Lieut.-Col. William C. Pollard, Little Testwood House of Col. the Hon. Edward Arthur Palk, Tatchbury Mount of John P. Heseltine and Loperwood Manor of Robert Charles Sutherland Pearce esq. H. T. Timson esq. George E. Briscoe Eyre esq. Henry Compton esq. and Col. W. C. Pollard are the chief landowners. The soil is heavy clay; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are wheat, oats and barley. The area is 3,881 acres of land and 7 of water; population in 1901 was 1,225. Rateable value, £8,443.

NURSING or NUTSHALLING.

(See also ROWNHAMS.)

A pleasant but scattered village and civil parish, situated on the river Test, with a station on the Southampton and Salisbury branch of the London and South Western railway, 5 miles north-west from Southampton, 3½ south from Romsey, 2 north from Redbridge railway station and 84 from London, in the New Forest division of the county, Romsey petty sessional division, union and county court district, Redbridge hundred, rural deanery of Romsey and Winchester archdeaconry and diocese. The church, dedicated to St. Boniface, date of register 1617, is a neat brick and stone edifice in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave, south transept and south porch, low western tower with wooden spire and 3 bells: the chancel was restored in 1882 and the remainder of the building in 1890: the church contains several monuments, one (white marble) being erected to the memory of the Rev. Robert Cranmer, who was rector here 33 years, and one to the Rev. John Lukin, who was rector for 37 years: in the vestry are recumbent stone effigies to Sir Richard Milliebart. dated 1613, Thomas Knollys 1751, and to one of the Morris family 1776: the font and lectern were presented in 1893 as memorials to Mr. and Mrs. Lees, formerly of Upton House: a stained glass window was erected in 1897 to the memory of C. C. Barton esq. and in 1904 handsome oak choir stalls, in the Jacobean style, were added, at a cost of £80, as a memorial to S. G. R. White, son of the present rector; there are

200 sittings. The living is a rectory, net yearly value £320, with 10 acres of glebe, and residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Winchester, and held since 1889 by the Rev. George Cecil White M.A., F.S.S. of Caius College, Cambridge. A new church room was erected in 1897 in commemoration of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee. The Wesleyans have a chapel here and Sunday school. Grove Place, now occupied by Clarence Wilson esq. is an ancient red brick mansion in the Elizabethan style, and approached by a double avenue of lime trees: the house was formerly used by Queen Elizabeth as a hunting-box; about 1860 the late Viscount Palmerston purchased it from the Crown, and it has since been restored. Mrs. Vaudrey-Barker-Mill, of Langley Manor, who is lady of the manor, and Wilfrid William Ashley M.P., J.P. of Broadlands, and Clarence Wilson esq. are the chief landowners. A portion of the parish has been assigned to the ecclesiastical parish district of St. John the Evangelist, Rownhams, and is now constituted a separate parish. The soil is gravel, sand and clay, and produces good barley, wheat and oats; subsoil, clay and gravel. The area is 1,508 acres of land and 22 of water and 6 of tidal water; rateable value, £3,408 Population of the parish in 1901 was 662.

UPTON is a hamlet, on the Romsey and Southampton road, half a mile north-east.

Here is a National School (mixed), with residence for master, built in 1871 & enlarged in 1894, for 170 children; average attendance, 120; W. Davis Barker, master
